Remind guests to resist giving your pets scraps from the table. We see an uptick of pancreatitis cases, which can be life threatening.

### Is your pet reactive to loud noises?

Whether it's a bustling living room or New Year's fireworks, calming treats, noise machines, and medication can all help pets feel less distressed during the holidays.



**Signs of anxiety/stress in cats:** Hiding, no or inappropriate urination, excessive vocalization, destructive behavior.

**Signs of anxiety/stress in dogs:** Licking lips/paws, destructive behavior, shaking, panting, hiding. 73%
